Re: Student Services Report

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The Student Services update tracks activity for special education aides, preschool enrollment, contracted services, out-of-district tuitions, and transportation.

The current forecast for aides includes 10.7 vacancies (8.7 current vacancies and 2.0 pending positions for additional needs) which are in the process of being filled. All of the vacancies are expected to be filled based on changes in need for services pending receipt of signed/accepted IEPs. The current projection shows a favorable balance of \$56,871 which is an improvement of \$44,120 since last month due to unhired vacancies.

Currently, there are 168 students in out of district placements including 32 for whom we have agreements with parents. In the month of October, one student returned to the district at the high school level, and two new parent agreements were reached (one at the elementary level and one at the middle school level). The current projection shows a total of \$143,677 in available funds, a reduction of \$52,617 since last month.

The Newton Early Childhood Program (NECP) currently serves 208 students. There are currently 73 students with special needs enrolled in preschool classrooms, an increase by two from last month. There are currently 72 students who are typically developing enrolled in preschool classrooms, an increase by two from last month. There are currently 63 students with special needs receiving related-services only, an increase by two from last month.

The forecast for contracted services projects a total of \$101,872 in available funds for FY14.

There are a total of 423 students receiving Special Education Transportation which is an increase of 24 since last month. The number of students receiving out-of district special education transportation is 124, and the number of students receiving in-district special education transportation is 299. The forecast for transportation projects to be under plan for FY14.
