

Newton North Behavioral and Health Guidelines for Mayor's Celebration Lane (6/7)

At Celebration Lane, Newton Public Schools administrators, principals, faculty, and staff, as well as our City leaders, will be lining the streets adjacent to NNHS to celebrate you (in an appropriately physically distanced manner!).

We look forward to seeing graduates and their immediate family at the Mayor's event on June 7th. We invite you and your family to drive (or bike or walk) through the "Celebration Lane" to say "see you again soon" and to give us the chance to say "thank you and best wishes!" Show your school spirit - decorate yourself and your mode of transportation, make joyful noise and be acknowledged for all you have accomplished during your high school years.

Newton North's Celebration Lane will be organized by Last Name. Entry to Celebration Lane will be at the following times:

3:00 PM Last Names A-I

3:30 PM Last Names J-Q

4:00 Last Names R-Z

Details about the Celebration Lane route, adjacent to NNHS, will be released closer to 6/7.

Below are some necessary behavioral expectations which will help create a safe and celebratory environment for all in attendance.

- Seniors should be passengers rather than drivers unless there is prior approval from their dean.
- All participants, including cyclists, vehicle drivers, vehicle passengers, and pedestrians, must:
 - Follow police directives;
 - Remain socially distanced from one another (at least 6 feet apart);
 - Not approach faculty/staff; and
 - Wear masks.
- Those parading in cars should stay in their vehicles.
- Drivers will:
 - Not stop along the route, or leave the route, unless specifically directed by police or in the event of a medical emergency; and
 - Adhere to all motor vehicle laws of the Commonwealth.
- No objects should be thrown from or passed between vehicles.
- Any banners, posters or displays should be aligned with NNHS Mission Statement and follow the rules outlined in the *Newton Rights and Responsibilities* handbook.
- Given the current health restrictions, individuals with any of the following health symptoms or restrictions may not participate in the celebration:
 - Signs of a fever or a measured temperature of 100 degrees or greater;
 - A cough;

- Trouble breathing within the past 24-hours;
- People who have been instructed to self-isolate or quarantine by their doctor or a local public health official.
- People who have been in recent contact with people who have been diagnosed with COVID-19 individuals.
